Aims of the Summer School

The Summer School will enable researchers and practitioners from all over the world to gain an insight into cutting edge topics in the area of IT Law and Legal Informatics. It is aimed at Law and Legal Informatics graduates as well as graduates from other areas of study to which IT Law and Legal Informatics are relevant. Students of these disciplines are also welcome to apply. Interest in cross-disciplinary and international collaboration is a prerequisite for participation.

Graduates are invited to apply to present and discuss their own research at the Summer School, giving them a unique opportunity to discuss their ideas and to benefit from group discussion.

Topic Areas

The four topic areas will be dealt with as four separate units. Each topic area will consist of a mix of lectures on the topic by a top-class lecturer and presentations by the participants who will put their own research up for discussion.

Social Program

The extensive social program will give the participants the opportunity to get to know one another in an informal setting. During our excursions, we will explore the Saarland and the surrounding region. We will visit a UNESCO World Heritage Site as well as other highlights.

The costs for the social program (excluding food and drinks) **are covered by the participation fee.**

Application Process and Participant Selection

The number of participants is limited to 30 with 15 places reserved for graduates who will present their own contributions to the Summer School.

Participation in the Summer School as a contributing graduate follows successful application and receipt of confirmation of participation from the organisers. Admission to present will be granted on the basis of the expertise of the candidate and the quality of the proposal submitted.

The remaining places will be allocated to successful applicants by confirmation of participation from the organisers.

Non-contributing participants will be admitted in the order in which the completed application documents were received by the organisers.

Your application should contain the following:

- the Application Form from the website;
- a tabular CV;
- a short statement (not exceeding 1 page) setting out your qualifications and why you are interested in taking part in the Summer School.

Participants who want to bring their own research contribution to the Summer School should also submit one proposal or two proposals for subjects for their own contribution (800 to 1,500 words each) with their application. If two proposals are sent, please indicate the preferred choice. The subjects must be from 2 of the 4 topic areas covered by the Summer School.

Costs and ECTS

Part-time attendance by participants is possible but a minimum of two topic blocks must be attended. Up to 4 ECTS points can be awarded to participants of the Summer School. Please see the website for further details.

A **participation fee of 250 Euro** is payable by each participant. This fee covers all seminars the social programme events as well as refreshments during the seminars. The cost of travel to Saarbrücken, accommodation and food and drinks (except the Opening Evening Event, Summer School BBQ and Farewell Party) are not included in the participation fee.

Participants attending **fewer than 4 topic blocks** will pay a reduced fee:

- 3 topic blocks: 200 Euro
- 2 topic blocks: 150 Euro

Location

The Summer School will take place at the Saarland University's campus in Saarbrücken, Germany. The academic program will take place at the University's Graduate Centre (Building C9 3).

Saarland University
